The Levites

What about you?

How do you feel about living on the gifts of others?

If your answer was one of the first three listed, then remember that the rest of the Israelites were to give support to the Levites as part of their worship of the God who provided for them. This is still true today: you receive your income as part of God's people's worship of him.

How does this make you feel?

If your answer was one of the last two listed, then remember that the Levites were not chosen by God to minister full-time and live on the gifts of others because they were more spiritual or more gifted than the rest of the Israelites. It is an exciting privilege to be supported in God's work by the gifts of others, but it is never a cause for arrogance or spiritual superiority.

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. [COLOSSIANS 3:23-24]
